National background:

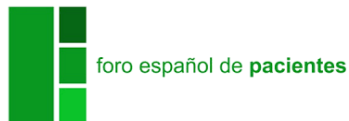
- Framework document about pain of the Ministry of Health and plans / strategies in Andalusia, Galicia, Extremadura and Madrid (in preparation). There is a majority of Autonomous Communities without pain among their priorities.
- Changes in the health policy scenario implies the need of a bigger institutional support.
- The initiatives carried out in recent years have allowed the creation of a fluid relationship with entities such as SED (Spain Pain Society), SEDISA (Spanish Association of Health Managers), national pain associations (POP, FEP, AGP), SECA (Spanish Association of Health Care Quality), (Spanish Association of Health Journalists).
- SIP is committed to a European project, where the different countries also act locally with the SIP brand

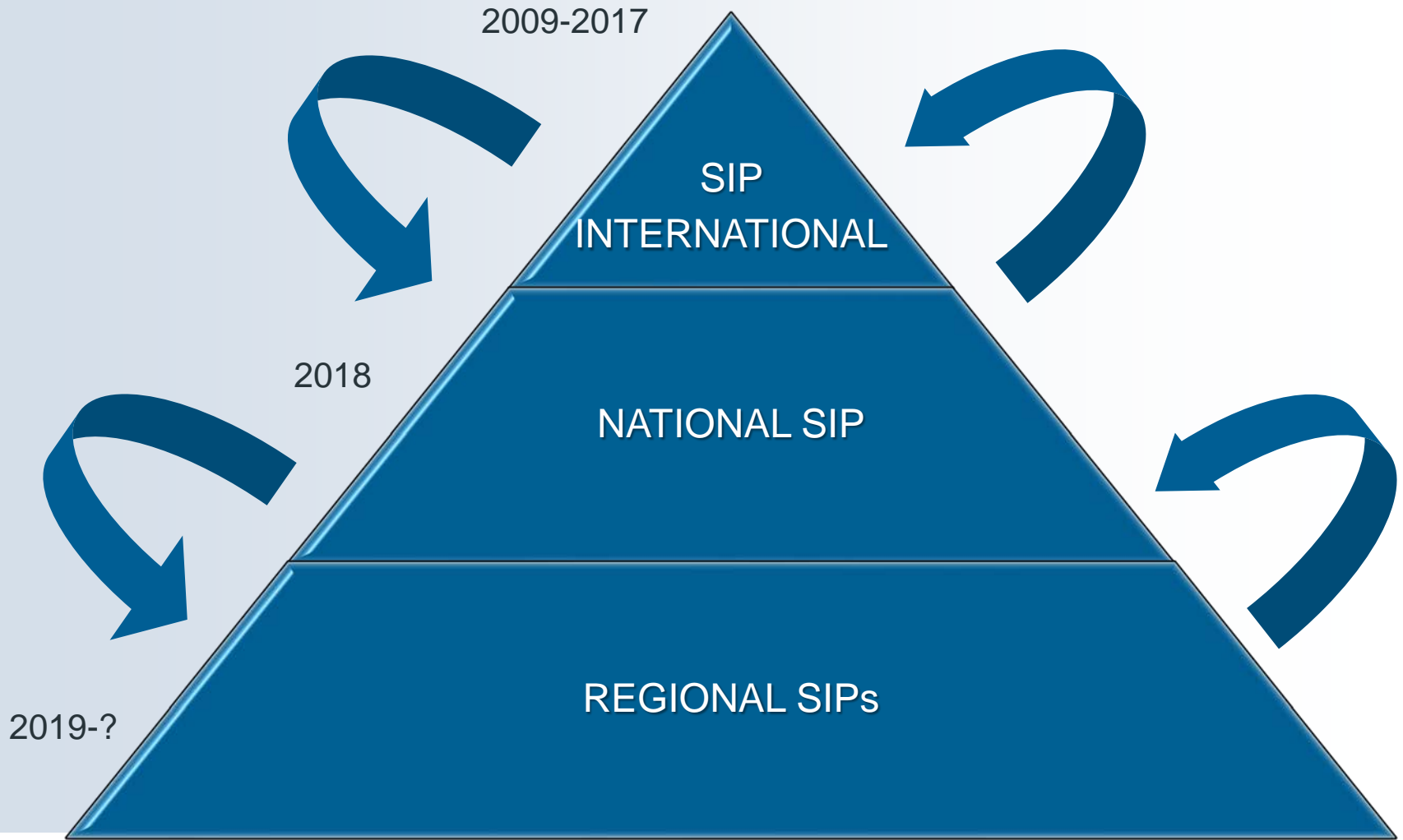
OBJECTIVES

General

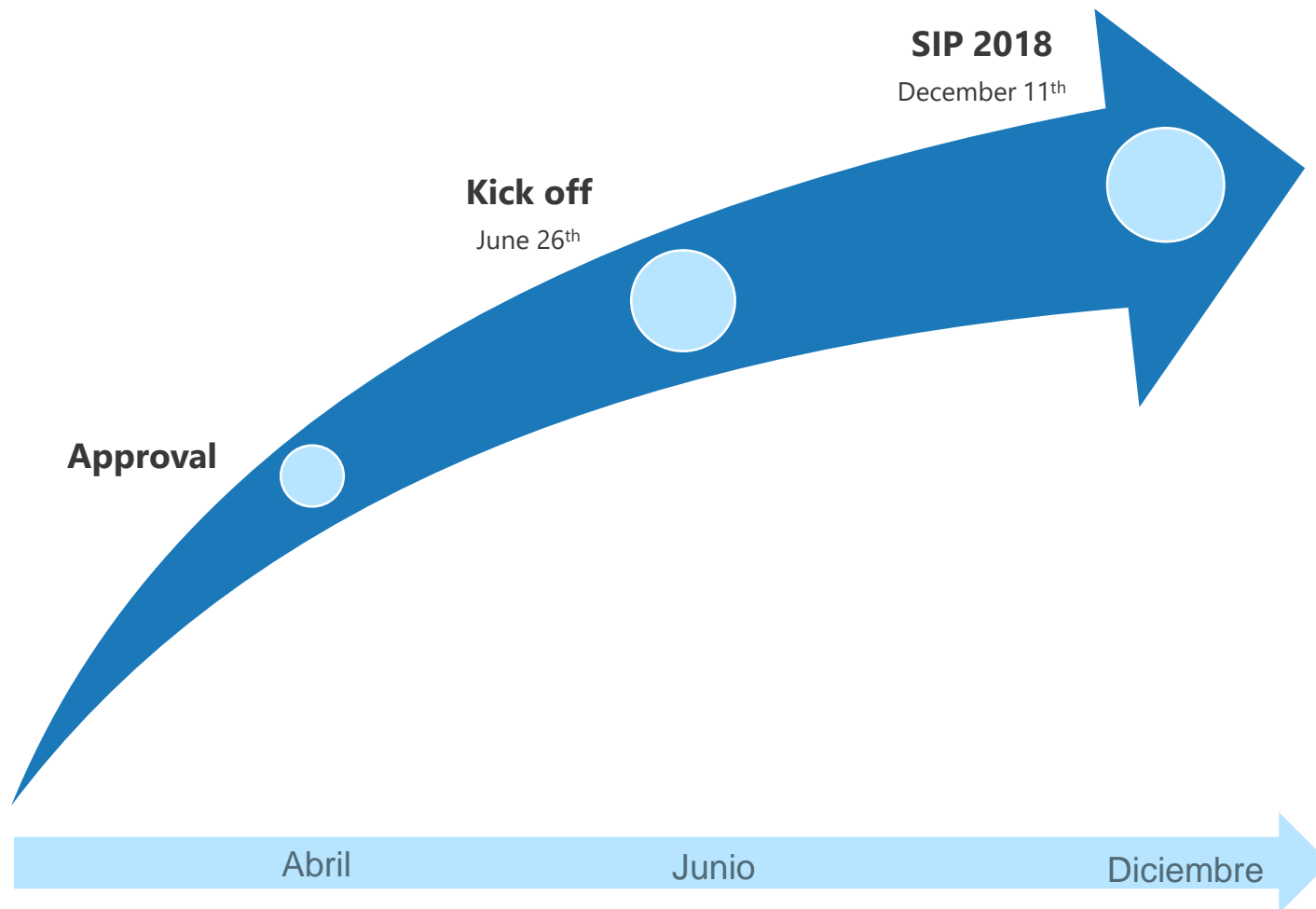
